This collection contains ledgers and correspondence from the Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen and one ledger from its women's group, Golden State Lodge.

HISTORICAL INFORMATION The Brotherhood of Railroad Brakemen was a cooperative association founded in the summer of 1883 in Albany, New York for the main purpose of providing disability benefits to its members. A rival Brotherhood of Railroad Brakemen branch was founded in 1883 by eight brakemen for the Delaware & Hudson Railroad who met secretly in Oneonota, New York. This group became Lodge No. 1 of the Brotherhood. By 1884, at their first annual convention, they had 39 lodges and 900 members in the United States and Canada. In January 1889, in Fort Gratiot, Michigan, the Brotherhood created a women's group which they named the Grand Lodge.

In 1890, the name of the organization was changed to the Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen. Concerned with practical issues such as providing pension and disability benefits for its members, the Brotherhood also supported shorter hours, better wages, education and other improved working conditions for its members. Grievance committees were set up to hear members' grievances against employers and to try to facilitate a resolution between employees and employers on these issues. The Brotherhood created an Auxiliary to do charitable works, such as the establishment of a home for indigent and elderly members, and tuberculosis research. In 1969, the Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen merged with the Brotherhood of Locomotive Firemen and Engineers, the Order of Railway Conductors and Brakemen, and the Switchmen's Union of North America to form the the United Transportation Union.

Series 2. FINANCIAL RECORDS

Contains financial records of the Sutter Lodge. Each ledger is divided into sections by type of financial record. There is a membership register, which lists the dues collected from each person. This is sometimes organized chronologically and sometimes organized alphabetically by surname. There is a section entitled cash book, which includes monthly disbursements on items such as postage, rent, benefit assistance, charitable contributions and other items. There is a section which keeps track of dues loaned to members. A quarterly report section contains monthly reports on the financial status of the Lodge. Some ledgers also contain information about the Brotherhood's insurance policies or keep track of new members.

Organized chronologically. There is some overlap between ledgers, i.e. one ledger for 1939-1943 and one for 1942-1945.

Series 5. MINUTES OF MEETINGS

Contains minutes of meetings of the Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen, Sutter Lodge No. 340. Includes discussions of such things as applications for membership, admissions of candidates, appointments of committees and their reports, charitable donations made by the Brotherhood, particularly to the Brotherhood home, a charity devoted to housing of indigent or elderly members. Minutes were kept in a separate ledger until 1909, when they began to be included in a Record book, which contained roll calls, annual election results and other information.

There is also a book containing minutes of the local Golden State Lodge, the women's arm of the Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen. Organized chronologically.
