Statement on Archival Language:

The David Allan Hubbard Library aims to describe archival materials in a way that is respectful to all communities who use, create, and are represented in our collections. However, the nature of historical materials is such that some material may represent positions, language, values, and

stereotypes that are not consistent with the current values and practices at Fuller Theological Seminary.

Within our finding aids, it is possible users may encounter language that is offensive or harmful. While some language included in finding aids was written by staff, other language originates from the people and organizations that created the material. For example, folder titles are often preserved from the creators. It is standard practice not to change them and, in some cases, it provides important context about the materials. When we find problematic language created by archivists and staff we strive to update it. When we find problematic language from the original creator we will transcribe as is to preserve the context of its creation.

Biographical History

Aimee Semple McPherson (October 9, 1980 – September 27, 1944) was a Canadian-American Pentecostal evangelist, faith healer, and founder of the International Church of the Foursquare Gospel (known as the Foursquare Church). Her use of popular media forms for publicity and within weekly sermons made her the most publicized Protestent evangelist of her day. McPherson's popularity enabled her contribution to the construction of Angelus Temple in Los Angeles, CA.

McPherson and her husband Robert Semple (m. Aug 12, 1908) became part of William Durham's Full Gospel Assembly, where Durham taught and applied principles from the Azusa Street Revival. William Durham ordained Aimee McPherson in 1909. The couple traveled to China to participate in an evangelistic crusade. She returned to the United States with her daughter after Robert's death. In 1911, she married Harold McPherson; Harold became the advance man in organizing the evangelistic campaigns. The couple divorced in 1921. McPherson married David Hutton on September 13, 1931 and divorced on March 1, 1934.

In 1917, McPherson began to publish *The Bridal Call*, a magazine of her sermons that particularly discussed women's religious roles and Pentcostalism. She also published the weekly *Foursquare Crusader* and became the first woman to preach a sermon over the radio. By 1918-1919, McPherson settled in Los Angeles, CA and constructed the Angelus Temple, one of the first megachurches, to enable her national audience to come to her. The Angeles Temple became known for its capacity to serve the social welfare of the Los Angeles community with a "first serve, investigate second" philosophy. It also hosted one of the few long-lasting commissaries during the United States' Great Depression.

Scope and Content

The McPherson collection consisted originally of a scrapbook, full of clippings from magazines and newspapers on the celebrated comings and goings of Aimee Semple McPherson. It included collected ephemera such as a postcard and a photo signed by McPherson.

The scrapbook emphasizes McPherson's use of the media, beginning with a clipping announcing her starring role in a "talkie," and ending with a publicized trip to the Holy Land by McPherson and her daughter. The scrapbook also includes the entire June 1930 issue of *Bridal Call* and a sacred opera written, *Regem Adorate* (Worship the King). Additional materials consist of McPherson's books, pamphlets, and other published works related to her ministry.

Later additions include research materials gathered by author Robert Bahr for his book, *Least of All Saints: The Story of Aimee Semple McPherson*. The research materials include

correspondence, photos, and interviews with members of McPherson's family. The items are arranged in alphabetical order.
