Statement on Archival Language:

The David Allan Hubbard Library aims to describe archival materials in a way that is respectful to all communities who use, create, and are represented in our collections. However, the nature of historical materials is such that some material may represent positions, language, values, and stereotypes that are not consistent with the current values and practices at Fuller Theological Seminary.

Within our finding aids, it is possible users may encounter language that is offensive or harmful. While some language included in finding aids was written by staff, other language originates from the people and organizations that created the material. For example, folder titles are often preserved from the creators. It is standard practice not to change them and, in some cases, it provides important context about the materials. When we find problematic language created by archivists and staff we strive to update it. When we find problematic language from the original creator we will transcribe as is to preserve the context of its creation.

Administrative History

The Philothean Fellowship was an organization initiated by Grace Payton Fuller and Mary Jane Smith for the training, community, and spiritual growth of the women at Fuller Theological Seminary. The original community in 1947 consisted of student, staff, and faculty wives, and grew to include all women of the Seminary staff and student body by the 1960s.

Philothean Fellowship membership included active members and associate members. Active members consisted of the wives of students of Fuller Theological Seminary. Associate members included the wives of the faculty, the wives of the staff, and female Seminary staff members and student body. Officer positions included a President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer elected by active members.

Regular Monday night meetings alternated between general meetings at the Seminary with a featured speaker or panel discussion and smaller group meetings for prayer and bible study. Yearly events included holiday parties, children's parties, and Baccalaureate celebrations.

Members of the Philothean Fellowship also advocated for women's inclusion in academic programs as early as 1947-1948. By 1974, wives of full-time students were permitted to audit classes at the Seminary without charge, or register for classes at one-quarter the regular tuition and pursue degrees. The group stayed active until 1974-1975, when its name transitioned to the "Women's Institute." The Women's Institute continued to provide intellectual and spiritual growth and fellowship for Fuller Seminary student wives through a variety of workshops and special interest classes.

The Office for Women's Concerns opened in August 1976 with the support of Roberta Hestenes and Libbie Patterson. The Office for Women's Concerns monitored all programs and decisions concerning female staff, students, and faculty at Fuller Seminary. The Office provided career counseling and advocate support for women on campus at all levels as well as coordinating all women's activities. The Woman Students Committee was also created, consisting of members from all three graduate schools, which addressed the planning of programs, workshops, and services for women students. The Women's Lectureship series was hosted by this office from 1983-2001 to expose the Fuller community to academic work being done by and about women. The Office for Women's Concerns and Committee of Women's Concerns were incorporated into the Student Engagement and Success department (as it was known in 2019).

The Women's Institute disbanded by 1980 as it folded into the short-lived Team Ministry (for all spouses of Fuller students), and a steering committee of Fuller spouses to link student wives to the Seminary community. A second community support group, FOCUS (1990-1999), helped student wives "who have an important and unique role as individuals and as part of married team going through the rigors and joys of graduate school" in small-group settings. The steering committee also sought to help student wives determine their own ministry through directed study, social events, and support programs. By 1993, the steering committee became the "Fuller Wives Fellowship," renamed "SUPPORT" in 1994. SUPPORT transitioned in name to CONNECT c. 2015, and operated with the support of Nancy Sunquist, wife of former SIS Dean Dr. Scott Sunquist.

During the original processing in 2013, the materials were integrated into Collection 138: Early Institutional Papers, 1947-1975. In 2015, the Philothean Fellowship materials were separated into their own collection. The materials were processed into its own collection in 2019.

Scope and Content

The Philothean Fellowship Collection, 1947-1961 consists of access and original copies of scrapbooks kept by members of the Fuller Theological Seminary student wives' group, the Philothean Fellowship. The scrapbooks include photographs, postcard invitations to Seminary social events and lectures, Fuller Seminary convocation and commencement brochures, and the newsletter *The Broadcaster*.
