Statement on Archival Language:

The David Allan Hubbard Library aims to describe archival materials in a way that is respectful to all communities who use, create, and are represented in our collections. However, the nature of historical materials is such that some material may represent positions, language, values, and

stereotypes that are not consistent with the current values and practices at Fuller Theological Seminary.

Within our finding aids, it is possible users may encounter language that is offensive or harmful. While some language included in finding aids was written by staff, other language originates from the people and organizations that created the material. For example, folder titles are often preserved from the creators. It is standard practice not to change them and, in some cases, it provides important context about the materials. When we find problematic language created by archivists and staff we strive to update it. When we find problematic language from the original creator we will transcribe as is to preserve the context of its creation.

Biographical History

Born in San Francisco on September 29, 1929, John G. Huber is a graduate of the Lutheran high school academy of California Concordia College in Oakland (1947), the University of California in Berkeley (B.A., 1952), and Concordia Seminary in St. Louis (M.Div., 1958). In 1965 he was married to Judy Bertolin, an elementary school teacher. Although they reside in La Jolla, Pastor Huber is an active member of Resurrection Lutheran Church in Coronado. He is a lifetime docent at Torrey Pines State Reserve where he enjoys hiking the trails.

Although a member of the ecumenically conservative Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, Pastor Huber has maintained a longstanding commitment to Christian unity, inspired in part by the North American Conference on Faith and Order at Oberlin, Ohio, in 1957. In 1958, his Master of Divinity thesis at Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, documented agreements reached by the three World Conferences on Faith and Order. During a 31-year ministry at University Lutheran Church in La Jolla, also serving the UCSD campus, he completed a Master of Theology (1972) and also a Doctor of Ministry program (1984) at Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary in Berkeley, writing dissertations on theological and pastoral aspects of interchurch relationships.

After his retirement in 2000 as Director of LACES—an inter-Lutheran continuing education agency for pastors in Southern California—he earned a Master of Arts degree in Ecumenical Studies (2001) at Bossey, the Ecumenical Institute of the World Council of Churches near Geneva, Switzerland, where, at 70, he was known as the “Village Elder.”

His travels to numerous countries on five continents have taken him to assemblies of the Lutheran World Federation and the World Council of Churches, the Parliament of the World’s Religions at Chicago (1993), as well as the 2001 Kirchentag at Frankfurt. On January 18-21, 2002, he witnessed the nine Protestant churches affiliated with COCU becoming “Churches Uniting in Christ” at a gathering in Memphis. Press credentials from a local Roman Catholic newspaper, *Southern Cross*, were given to him when he attended the 75th anniversary celebration of Faith and Order at Lausanne and the Central Committee meeting of the WCC at Geneva in 2002, and also the LWF Assembly held at Winnipeg in 2003 and the WCC Assembly in Porto Alegre in 2006. He authored the theological preamble of the Ecumenical Council of San Diego County in 1969 and chaired its Faith, Order and Witness Committee. He serves on the Board of Directors of that Council and of the North American Academy of Ecumenists. Huber is a member of the Faith and Order Commission of the Southern California Ecumenical Council.

Scope and Content

John G. Huber, retired minister in the Lutheran Church, Missouri Synod, refers to himself as an “ecumenthusiast.” Since attending the Oberlin Faith and Order Meeting of 1957, he has been involved in an ever-enlarging scope of local and international ecumenical activities, all of which are reflected in this collection, which documents more than 50 years of American and International ecumenical meetings, dialogs, publications and initiatives. When necessary, John Huber attended meetings as a member of the Press corps, reporting for the *Southern Cross* on

such events as the 75th anniversary celebration of Faith and Order at Lausanne and the WCC Assembly in Porto Alegre in 2006.

The collection of 1460 books and 47 boxes of archival papers is accompanied by an annotated bibliography by John G. Huber.
