The Show of Shows: Picasso, modernism's father, comes home to MOMA. Time, May 26, 1980. Pp 70-83. Discussion of Picasso exhibition Sept 16 at the Museum of Modern Art in NY City. Includes many images of his work and biographical information.

Discussion of the Tiffany factory outside Newark, NJ, the history of the factory, photo of it, and photos of a few Tiffany items.

Hanes, Phyllis. Danish Porcelain follows Old Traditions: Same Techniques Used for 200 Years. Monterey Peninsula Herald. Aug. 6, 1980. P. 24. Discussed Royal Blue Copenhagen porcelain history, factory and some of the patterns.

Glassmaking – From Volcanoes to Tiffany. San Francisco Chronicle, Aug 8, 1980. P.23.

Discussion of the Corning Glass Museum in NY including some of the items on display.

Maloney, John. Collecting the Blues. American Collector. February 1973. P 14-15. Discussion of Staffordshire wares which are blue and were popular in England and America. Includes brief discussion of J&R Clews who owned Staffordshire pottery.
