Scope and Content Notes: Dwight Stanley Long's (1912-2001*) adventures as a circumnavigator, photographer and film director between 1930 and 1959 are revealed in photograph albums, programs, correspondence, books, articles, and press releases. His 32' ketch, the IDLE HOUR, was sailed around the world on a tour from 1934 to 1940, and the subject of a movie entitled "Sailing All Seas", as well as his numerous articles, and book by the same title.

The collection is focused on the voyage made in the IDLE HOUR, although some photographic prints were collected and the film "Tanga Tika" made years after the voyage. Long made many appearances in London, England and New York City to publicize his voyage in the IDLE HOUR as it was one of the few made in the early twentieth century. See Harry Pidgeon's "Around the world Single-handed", 1942 for comparison.

The photograph albums and scrapbooks were created after the voyage; the collection contains some created much later. Long gave lectures on his tour, but also did the same as late as 1983 in Los Angeles where he lived after World War II until his death in 2001. His photographs are evidence of native peoples and places in the late 1930s which may have radically changed recently.

*Dates are approximate. Los Angeles Times Obituary dated July 15, 2001 states that Long was 89 when he died.

Biography: Dwight Long, sailor, lecturer, and documentary filmmaker, was born and raised in Seattle, Washington. In 1934 he left Seattle to sail a 32 ft. ketch, the "IDLE HOUR", around the world via the Pacific, Indian and Atlantic Oceans to the East Coast of the United States when the ketch was severly damaged in the hurricane of 1938. Long wrote a book, "Sailing All Seas" documenting his circumnavigation of the globe. He lectured in numerous cities both during and following his journey. During World War II he joined the U.S. Navy and became a documentary

film producer. After the War, he continued making films, such as "Tanga Tika", released in 1954. Long died in Los Angeles in 2001.

Arrangement and Description: Material is arranged in two series to denote the voyage of the IDLE HOUR in Series 1 with later years in Series 2. Series 1 also contains the chronometer used by Long on his voyage. Series 1, except for the chronometer is stored in Boxes 1 and 2; Box 3 and 4 contain items from both series. Series 1 denotes items from correspondence to photographs chronicling his travels, evidence of his films and books, with albums, scrapbooks and loose photographs and negatives. Series 2 has loose photographs, without notes on recto.
