The Bolton Papers relate to the affairs of the Duke of Bolton, who was father to the wife of the third Earl of Bridgewater. On the de-  
-cease of the Duke of Bolton (the Earl of Bridgewater being a  
devizee under his Will) disputes arose in connection with the trust,  
many Bills were filed and proceedings taken. They were principally  
a Bill of Tobias Jenkins and Charles Duke of Bolton & the Dowager

*The first Earl of Ellesmere*

"This Report is signed 'Thos. Townshend', but it is wholly in Spanish, and addressed to 'A Majesta'. It speaks of the efforts of Lieut. Governor Johnston in 1764 for the amelioration of agriculture, his ordinances for the encouragement of fences, the extirpation of goats, and the introduction of mulberry and fig trees. The prices are all calculated in zelines or shillings and the revenue in pounds sterling. Major General Johnston was a very distinguished officer, and is frequently mentioned in Horace Walpole's correspondence as 'Irish Johnston' (though a Scotchman), because he was born in Dublin. He was made Lieutenant Governor and Commander in Chief of Minorca in 1763, and retained that command till 1774. He seems to have lost no time in endeavouring to ameliorate the condition of the inhabitants. He died a General in 1797. Minorca was twice in possession of this country. It was taken during the Spanish War of Succession by General Stanhope in 1708, and recaptured by the French in 1756, a loss which cost Admiral Byng his life. At the Peace of Paris, in 1763, it was again ceded to us, and was finally made over to Spain in 1783, at the same period that we acknowledged the independence of the United States. Thomas Townshend is no doubt the well known politician, ancestor of the present Viscount Sydney".

Thomas Townshend was probably Colonel Townshend commanding the forces in Minorca.
