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Biography/Administrative History

William Fellows Englebright

William Fellows Englebright, born in New Bedford, Massachusetts, November 23, 1855. After completing his engineering studies with the U.S. Navy, Englebright settled in Nevada City, California, as a mining engineer where he worked with W.W. Waggoner surveying mines and was later appointed U.S. Deputy Mineral Surveyor. A Republican, Englebright was elected to Congress, filling James N. Gillette's seat when he resigned. He represented the California 1st District 1906-1911 and served on the Committee on Mines and Mining. Englebright owned the Berlin Consolidated Mine, Nevada City, and was secretary of the Blue Consolidated Gravel Mining Company. After running unsuccessfully for reelection in 1910, he resumed his mining engineer career. He died in 1915.

William F. Englebright was the father of Harry Lane Englebright (1884-1943), U.S. Representative, California 2nd District, 1926-1943. Graduating from the University of California at Berkeley with a mining engineering degree, the younger Englebright became the mineral inspector for the General Land Office and later an engineer for the State Conservation Commission of California 1911-1914. As congressman, Englebright was the minority whip. Englebright Lake in California is named for him.

Henry Lund (Knud Henry Lund) - Henry Lund & Co.

Born in Norway in 1832, Knud Henry Lund, also known as Henry Lund, studied navigation. Enticed by the discovery of gold in California, Lund arrived in San Francisco in 1851. Unsuccessful in the California mines, Lund returned to San Francisco, and in 1854 he joined Messrs. Cross & Co., where he worked as a clerk and later the assistant manager of the large commercial business.

In 1866, Lund set up his own business in San Francisco (214 Montgomery, 628 Montgomery) as an importer, shipping and commission merchant, known as Henry Lund & Co., which became very prosperous. Examples of goods his company handled were cement and steel. In 1882, he went to Liverpool where he established a branch of his San Francisco enterprise, Lund, Beveridge Co. Henry Lund & Co. also served as agents for the Reliance Marine Insurance Co. Limited of Liverpool, the General Agency for Det Norske Veritas, and agents for the Northern Shipowners' Association. In 1884 the King of Sweden and Norway asked Lund to be the Swedish and Norwegian consul in San Francisco. The following year the king selected him consul for California, Washington, Oregon and Alaska. As trade between the Scandinavian countries and the Pacific Coast was nearly non-existent at that time, Lund worked to increase commerce between the two. He created five vice-consulate positions along the west coast which resulted in bringing many Swedish and Norwegian ships to the Pacific shores. Lund died in 1919.

William Lund - William Lund & Co.

William Lund's was the brother of Knud Henry Lund. His company William Lund & Co., based in Guaymas, Sonora, Mexico, shipped lumber in the 1880s and 1890s, some of which were used in building mine shafts. In the mid-1890s, Captain William Lund was an agent for Lloyds of London in Guaymas.

James J. Ott

Chemist and metallurgist James J. Ott, born in Schaffhausen, Switzerland, February 29, 1826, was Nevada City's (California) principal assayer, whose work was considered by many trustworthy. The first cousin of John Sutter, owner of Sutter's Mill, Ott settled in Sierra County during the Gold Rush, opening a store where he sold mining equipment and melted gold dust. In 1852 he moved to Nevada City, California, where in collaboration with German metallurgist Frederick Blesseten created and perfected the Chlorination Process, which retrieves gold from quartz without losing much gold. His assay of Nevada ore in 1859 resulted in the discovery of the Comstock Lode, which set off the silver rush.

After Ott turned his assay enterprise over to employees, he concentrated more on promoting mines. People throughout the world consulted with Ott before buying mines. He was the primary owner of the United, Oriental, Italien, LeCompton Quartz Mines, and had interests in some placer and hydraulic diggings. The assay office became the headquarters of the Meadow Lake Mine & Smelting Co. and the Meadow Lake Turnpike Company. He participated in various Nevada City social and administrative activities such as the Nevada City Council, Odd Fellow Lodge, and Swiss Mutual Benefit Society. His son Emil Ott took over the assay business after Ott's death in 1907. Upon Emil's death in 1953, the assay office was closed. The J. J. Ott Nevada Assay Office is California Historical Landmark N. 832.

Waldo Wade Waggoner (W.W. Waggoner)

Born in Illinois June 14, 1860, W.W. Waggoner played a key role in the expansion of the gold mining industry. Those who guided important mining operations in Nevada County and other adjoining counties considered Waggoner a trustworthy associate. Graduating from the University of Illinois with a mining degree, he was best known for being a hydraulic mining engineer and U.S. Deputy Mineral Surveyor in Nevada City, California. In his youth he traveled to Persia and Central America settling in Nevada City in the 1890s. He surveyed mines with William F. Englebright. Waggoner was State Debris Commissioner and in 1906 W.B. Bourne of Eureka Lake and River Canal Company and the Northern Water and Power Company hired Waggoner as chief engineer. Waggoner was a member of the American Society of Civil Engineers and president of the local chamber of commerce. Rainfall and weather data were his hobby, and his records extended thirty years. Waggoner died in 1939.

Milton Mining and Water Company

Milton Mining and Water Company was founded in 1872 as an offshoot of the North Bloomfield Gravel Mining Company (see "Waggoner's Speech on History of North Bloomfield Mining and Gravel Company, Box B001174). It conducted hydraulic gold-mining in French Corral, Nevada County. It owned one of the state's main water ditches which provided water for its hydraulic ventures and three dams which formed the English reservoir. The Milton Mining and Water Company operated the world's first long-distance telephone line (sixty miles), which was built in 1877 by the Ridge Telephone Company for the mining company and two others in the area, North Bloomfield Mining Company and Eureka Lake and Yuba Canal Company. The communication provided by this phone line helped these mining

companies control water flowing from the reservoirs to their hydraulic mining activities. This type of mining was outlawed in 1884. The company's former building site in Nevada County is California Landmark No. 247.

North Bloomfield Mining and Gravel Company

North Bloomfield Mining and Gravel Company, founded in 1866 according to Waggoner near the town of North Bloomfield, and was one of California's key hydraulic gold-mining enterprises, developing a large system of canals and flumes. In the late 19th century, the company ran the Malakoff Mine, the largest and best known hydraulic operation in the world. According to Waggoner, not only was the mine known for its mining operations but also for its reservoir and canal construction and maintenance (see Waggoner's notes Box B001174). Over 300 Chinese laborers built dams and ditches for the company. An 8,000-foot tunnel, designed by Hamilton Smith and completed in 1874, was considered an engineering masterpiece. Spurred by the damage caused by the debris depositing in the Sacramento Valley, farmers filed a suit against North Bloomfield Mining and Gravel Company. In 1884 Judge Lorenzo Sawyer of the U.S. Circuit Court suspended its hydraulic mining as it was harming California waterways. This landmark decision is considered one of California's as well the nation's first environmental protection laws. Malakoff Diggins State Park is the site of the former mining company.

Pioneer Pulp Company

The Pioneer Pulp Company manufactured wood pulp in Alta, Placer County, California, producing box or cardboard used for lining and roofing houses and book covers. Allen Towle was the company's president, and treasurers Albert Dibblee and Nathan A. Dodge worked in San Francisco. The company had a business relationship with Towle Brothers and Co., the largest lumber company in Placer County, which had a wood-pulp mill and transported lumber on their narrow-gauge railroad. The 1905 San Francisco Directory shows the business address of the Pioneer Pulp Company and the Towle Brothers and Co. as the Kohl Building, San Francisco.

Towle Brothers

Brothers Allen and George Towle created logging enterprises near Dutch Flat, Gold Run and the foothills to fulfill the hydraulic mining industry's need to construct wooden flumes which transported water to the mining sites. Their business office was based in San Francisco.

Scope and Contents:

The collection, whose 44 boxes span 1848-1936, consists mainly of documents related to mining: assays, surveys, claims (including water), patent applications, labor, and expenditures. Numerous Nevada County mining companies are featured. Additionally it contains items associated with wood pulp production and machinery, various paper companies, lumber and other merchandise shipping, match production, physician and weather records. Papers also relate to the wreckage of the "Selene", the 1907 Champion Mines vs. Home Gold Mining Co.

case, and the 1868 V.G. Bell et al. versus The Bed Rock Tunnel and Mining Company case.

People featured prominently in the collection are W.F. Englebright (mining engineer and congressman), Harry L. Englebright (mining engineer and congressman), Henry Lund or Knud Henry Lund (importer, shipping and commercial merchant), William Lund (shipping merchant), James J. Ott (mineral assayer), Waldo Wade Waggoner (hydraulic mining engineer), Albert Dibblee (Pioneer Pulp Co. treasurer), and Nathan A. Dodge (Pioneer Pulp Co. treasurer).

According to W.W. Waggoner's daughter, Dorothy Waggoner, W.F. Englebright was one of the many mining men who visited her father's Nevada City's office. "My father's 'survey boys' were Bill and Harry Englebright." Her accounts suggest that they all knew each other socially as well. Stationery in the collection showing the Waggoner's and W.F. Englebright's names together suggest they also did business together.

Major companies featured in the collection are Henry Lund & Co. (importing and shipping), William Lund & Co. (lumber shipping), Pioneer Pulp Company, Towle Brothers & Co., Milton Mining Co., and North Bloomfield Gravel and Mining Company. Waggoner's notes on the the history and operations of the Milton Mining and Water Company, North Bloomfield Gravel Mining Company and the Northern Water and Power Company are located in Box B001174. A partial list of other minor companies and organizations appearing in the collection include American Mining Congress, Blake Moffitt and Towne, California Paper Co., Chinese labor companies (e.g. Ah Chu, Ah Lun, Ah Yip, Kim Fong, China Gang, Ah George), Citizens Bank (Nevada City), Congregational Church (Nevada City), Crocker-Woolworth National Bank (San Francisco), Grass Valley Agency Citizens Bank, Jean le Dey Petitjean and Company, Lloyds of London, Lund, Beveridge & Co. (Liverpool), Miner's Association, Nevada City U.S. Post Office, Nevada City Sportsman's Club, Nevada Electric, Northern Power and Water Co., Northern Water and Power Company, Pacific Gas and Electric Company, Schellhorn Brewer, State of California Mining Bureau, Thomas Price & Son, South Yuba Mining Co., U.S. Department of Interior, Wells Fargo, and Young America Company.

Setting and locations are Amador County, El Dorado County, Nevada County, Placer County, San Francisco, Sierra County, Siskiyou County, Yuba County, Baker County (Oregon), and Guaymas, Mexico.

Types of materials included are: accounts, banking documents, bills (e.g. freight), news clippings, ledgers, payrolls, records (e.g. assay, water), scrapbooks, maps, plats, receipts (e.g. bullion, provision), mining pamphlets and bulletins, notebooks, reports, labor time books, correspondence, charts, business diaries and journals (e.g. mining, weather, doctor), mining patent applications, mine field notes, mineral surveys, mining statistics, labor affidavits, legal agreements, mineral certificates, claims (e.g. mining and water), mine stock certificates (blank), mineral deeds, court transcripts, vouchers, statements, telegrams, leases, by-laws and incorporation documents, memorandum, minutes, insurance policies, and invoices.
