Abstract: These letters were written to Mr. Humbert L. Gianetti and his family between 1906 and 1932. Most are by Ethel Reeve Haines who became his wife in 1922. Mr. Gianetti came to Pasadena from Saranac, New York, in 1908. He was an important figure in real estate and civic affairs until his death in 1951. The letters were found buried in a yard at 645 So. Catalina Ave.
