BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL DESCRIPTION

Vernon L. Kellogg was born in Emporia, Kansas, on December 1, 1867. Kellogg studied at the University of Kansas and Cornell University, as well as in Europe. He was on the faculty at the University of Kansas from 1890 until 1894 and was a professor of entomology at Stanford University from 1894 until 1920. During and after World War I, Kellogg was active in civilian relief efforts in Europe, serving as director of American Committee for Relief in Belgium, 1915-1916; assistant to the U.S. Food Administrator, 1917-1919; chief of the mission to Poland, Russia and other services in Europe with the American Relief Administrator, 1918-1921. He died on August 8, 1937.

Charlotte Hoffman Kellogg was born in 1874 at Grand Island, Nebraska, and was educated at the University of California, earning a Ph.B. in 1900. She taught English at Miss Head's School in Berkeley, California from 1903 until 1907. During World War I, she participated in civilian relief efforts in occupied Belgium and was a member of the Commission for Relief in Belgium and speaker for the U.S. Food Administrator. She was the author of several books about Belgium and Poland. Kellogg died on May 8, 1960.

Artist and photographer Jean Kellogg Dickie (1910-1995) was born in Berkeley, California. She was the only child of Vernon L. Kellogg, an author and professor of entomology at Stanford University, and Charlotte Hoffman Kellogg, a teacher, author, and poet. The Kelloggs purchased

a home on "Professor's Row" in Carmel, and the family became actively involved in the town's vibrant arts scene. In 1927, when she was just 17, Jean became a founding member of the Carmel Art Association.

Jean grew up in Washington, D.C., where her father had been invited to establish the National Research Council. She attended the Yale University School of Fine Arts and studied with Fernand Leger, Paul Dougherty, and Yasuo Kuniyoshi. She became best known as an accomplished graphic artist, and her illustrations for a limited edition of Robinson Jefferson's poem "The Loving Shepherdess" were widely praised.

In 1930, the Kellogg family moved to their summer home in the Carmel Highlands, where Jean befriended photographer Edward Weston. Her friendship with Weston inspired her to move into the field of photography. Jean married cartoonist James Dickie in 1960 and had her own gallery in Carmel Valley. She died in Monterey in 1995.

SCOPE AND CONTENT

The bulk of this collection contains the personal and professional papers of Jean Kellogg Dickie, covering the 1920s to the 1990s. Her correspondence is wide ranging and includes longrunning correspondence with family and friends, such as Rosalind Rajagopal, the co-founder of the Happy Valley School in Ojai, California; Robinson Jeffers scholar Robert Brophy; and Rev. William Monihan, the University of San Francisco's director of library relations. It also includes professional correspondence regarding three of Jean's books, "The Loving Shepherdess," "Design the Natural Way," and "Artist's Proof," as well as her trip to India in 1956-1957 and subsequent lecture on the trip. Additionally, there are notebooks with Jean's notes on art techniques and philosophy; a memory book of her trip to Europe in 1925-1926; her journal/guestbook, and birdwatching diary, spanning 1963 to 1993; drafts of her autobiography "Artist's Proof"; a partial draft of a biography of her parents, "A Memoir of Two Americans"; photographs of friends and family from the 1880s-1990s; and papers and correspondence relating to her husband, cartoonist James Dickie.

There is also one box of material on Charlotte and Vernon Kellogg, including articles, papers and poems by both Charlotte and Vernon; correspondence between Charlotte, Vernon and Jean; correspondence and papers related to three of Charlotte Kellogg's books, "Jadwiga," "Paderewski," and "Prelude"; and some papers and correspondence relating to two of Charlotte's brothers, Carl and Martin Hoffman.

The bulk of Charlotte and Vernon Kellogg papers were donated by Jean Kelloggg Dickie to the Hoover Institution and to Yale University Library. Jean also donated many of her own papers

documenting her personal life and artistic career to Yale, resulting in gaps in the papers held at the Harrison Memorial Library.
