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Appendix A: Bibliography. 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Appendix B: “National Archives of Nigeria: Kaduna (NAK) – List of Files Pertaining to the Jos Plateau and Its Peoples,” by David C. Tambo, 7 July 2013.

The richest source of archival material relating to the period of British rule in northern Nigeria are the government records deposited at the National Archives in Kaduna. Jos Plateau-related materials begin with the 1902 occupation of Bauchi. Until the creation of Plateau Province in 1926, the Jos Plateau was part of Bauchi Province. Within the colonial administrative hierarchy, each province in northern Nigeria contained several divisions which further were divided into districts. In some cases independent districts were carved out, which were directly subordinate to the provincial administration. Officials in the divisions and districts submitted reports to the Resident of the province and the Resident in turn used the material from the various district and division reports to compile his provincial report which was forwarded to the Northern Nigeria regional offices. Reports on expeditions, patrols and tours contain the most detailed accounts available on initial British contact with Plateau groups.

During the early years of colonial rule, British officials also collected a wide assortment of historical, ethnographic, and linguistic material to provide a basis for administrative decisions concerning the selection of local 'traditional' officials and the determination of political boundaries. To provide a reservoir of economic information for tax purposes, they researched such topics as market prices for basic commodities, land tenure patterns, crop yields and house-hold composition. The findings, along with recommendations for tax rates, appeared in assessment and reassessment reports.

Additional information of historical interest oftentimes is found in the 'pagan' administration and reorganisation reports describing British efforts to uncover forms of political authority on the Plateau which could be superimposed or adapted in various local situations to meet colonial administrative needs. District notebooks and intelligence reports, for the most part initiated in the 1920s and 1930s, provide further material of historical interest.

The following list of files was compiled during visits to NAK, as part of Ph.D. fieldwork for the University of Wisconsin-Madison, conducted 1975-1976. The focus of the research was economic history of ethnic groups on the Jos Plateau and adjacent areas in the latter nineteenth century and early twentieth century, especially relating to iron working and trade in iron items.
