I. Introduction

The Gerard Collection contains the personal, professional and family papers of Dr. Ralph Waldo Gerard (1900-1974), neurologist, behavioral scientist and educator. One of the most productive and distinguished neurobiologists of his time, Dr. Gerard's interests ranged widely from mitochondric metabolism to computers in education. He pioneered work on problems concerning nerve metabolism and nerve conduction, electrical activity in the brain during sleep and the nature of brain waves, regeneration in the central nervous system, and the action of drugs and hormones on the functioning of nerve cells. He was deeply interested in the biological basis of mental illness, particularly schizophrenia, and challenged the accepted theory that mental desease was purely psychological and cultural in origin.

Dr. Gerard was also interested in the broader aspects of science: the biology of ethics and language, cultural evolution and education, and the relationship between science and religion. He was concerned about the impact of science on public policy and on society in general.

Dr. Gerard's pursuit of these interests resulted in a remarkable harvest of publication, including nine books and over 700 articles.

He also served as editor of several scientific journals including the Journal of Neurophysiology, Physiological Review and the American Journal of Physiology.

Dr. Gerard held administrative posts in both private and governmental institutions. He was chairman of panels at the National Science Foundation the National Institute of Mental Health, the Office of Naval Research

and was a consultant to the Chief of Naval Research, the Surgeon

General and the National Aeronautics and Space Administration. He

also served as a member of the Executive Committee, the Stress Sub
committee and the Biology Council of the National Research Council.

For his many contributions to science and education, Dr. Gerard received numerous awards both in this country and abroad. He was elected to both the National Academy of Science and the American Academy of Arts and Sciences. Honorary degrees were conferred on him by the University of Leiden (Holland), the University of St. Andrews (Scotland), McGill University (Montreal), Brown University and the University of Maryland.

An educator as well as a scientist, Dr. Gerard's career centered around professorships at four major universities: the University of Chicago, the University of Illinois, the University of Michigan and the University of California, Irvine. He served the Irvine campus as the founding dean of the Graduate division, a position he held until his retirement in 1970.

II. The Collection

The Gerard Collection contains materials in depth from all periods of Dr. Gerard's career. It includes college papers and notes, personal and professional correspondence, research ideas and notes as well as notes and draft reports of experiments, papers relating to his many travels and lectures, photographs, awards and memorabilia, and newspapers and other ephemeral material. There are over 100 original manuscripts of articles and lectures.

The main body of the collection is organized in chronological units which correspond to the major periods of Dr. Gerard's career. Professional

correspondence and related papers comprise a principal sub-group in all but the first chronological section. The integrity of the folder organization of these materials as they were maintained in Dr. Gerard's files has been preserved. Other subgroupings are arranged according to specific projects and interests. Such groupings include papers concerning the Schizophrenia Project of the Mental Health Research Institute of the University of Michigan, work with the military during and after World War II, the National Research Council's Subcommittee on Stress, the American Physiological Society's Survey of the Physiological Sciences, the Committee on Behavioral Sciences at the University of Chicago and the Center for Advanced Study in the Behavioral Sciences in Stanford, California. Among the special subject units dating from Dr. Gerard's U.C. Irvine period are materials relating to the Grand Jury of Orange County, the Health Planning Committee of U.C. Irvine, the role of computers and programmed learning in education, controversies over student acitvists, and the question of the interpretation of evolution in school textbooks.

The remainder of the collection falls outside the chronologically organized units. Here will be found an extensive body of personal correspondence, manuscripts of articles and lectures, legal documents, photographs, newspaper clippings, awards and medals, and other memorabilia.

The collection is housed in 114 document boxes occupying approximately 104 linear feet. The primary research aid is an inventory describing the contents of each box.
