Inventory created by Isaac Fellman, based on a preliminary survey completed by Marjorie Bryer in 2011. Funding for processing the original donation of the collection was provided by the Council on Library and Information Resources (CLIR).

This inventory uses terminology for LGBTQ people that was in current use at the time of its creation. Descriptive language for queer identities evolves quickly and some of these terms may now be dated or even offensive. Finding aids are themselves historical documents; they reflect the moment in which they were written and often reflect the terms that subjects used for themselves. Biographical/Organizational History Note: *Song of the Loon* (1970), based on the 1966 novel of the same name, was one of the first feature films created by and for gay men. Richard Amory wrote both the novel and the screenplay, and Shan V. Sayles – owner of several gay male theaters, including San Francisco's Nob Hill Cinema – produced the film.

Scope and Content: The collection contains the original positive and negative 35mm and 16mm prints of the film, videotapes, financial records, promotional materials, a copy of the screenplay, and Polaroid snapshots, including candid photos of the cast on set. Researchers should note that some materials are housed at the Outfest Legacy Project at the UCLA Film and Television Archive.

Cartons 1-2 contain prints/negatives of the film and 2 ³/₄" videotapes. Carton 3 includes candid photographs; flyers, posters, advertisements and other publicity materials, such as a press book and publicity photos; a screenplay; employment and theater contracts; articles about the making of *Song of the Loon*; and the 1998 Something Weird release of *Song of the Loon*. There is also a U-Matic video featuring footage from the hardcore pornographic film *Boys in Chains*, circa late 1960s, and VHS tapes from BFP Video's Duo series from the 1990s.
